RESOLUTION 00-19

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF WITHDRAWING FROM THE UTAH TRANSIT AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, Spanish Fork City is part of the Utah Transit Authority (UTA) area; and

WHEREAS, being part of the UTA area causes to be imposed a 1/4% sales tax on all purchases made within Spanish Fork City; and

WHEREAS, the sales tax generates \$586,715.00 per year in revenue to UTA; and

WHEREAS, based upon an apparent lack of riders, UTA is amending its routes, eliminating much of the service within Spanish Fork City; and

WHEREAS, due to the lack of service provided by UTA, it is reasonable to allow the


voters of the City the opportunity to continue with UTA, or to withdraw and allocate that money to other needs or eliminate the 1/4% sales tax altogether;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Spanish Fork City Council as follows:


1. That a proposition be placed on the ballot for the general election to be held in November, 2000 presenting to the voters of Spanish Fork City the question of whether Spanish Fork City should withdraw from the Utah Transit Authority.
2. The Mayor and staff of Spanish Fork City are hereby authorized to take the necessary measures in order to have this proposition placed on the November, 2000 general ballot.
