

ADOPTED MINUTES  
SPANISH FORK CITY COUNCIL MEETING  
OCTOBER 4, 1989

THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY MAYOR J. MERRILL HALLAM AT 7 PM. THE INVOCATION WAS OFFERED BY COUNCILMEMBER SHAW.

COUNCILMEMBERS PRESENT: MAYOR J. MERRILL HALLAM, AND COUNCILMEMBERS JERALD CHAPPLE, THORA SHAW, JACK LEIFSON, REX WOODHOUSE, AND T. PAGE HARRISON.

STAFF MEMBERS PRESENT: DAVID A. OYLER, CITY ADMINISTRATOR; CLYDE A. SWENSON; DEE ROSENBAUM, PUBLIC SAFETY DIRECTOR; RICHARD HEAP, ENGINEER; PAUL LARSEN, BUILDING INSPECTOR; JUNIOR BAKER, CITY ATTORNEY, AND MARY-CLARE MASLYN, ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT.

CITIZENS PRESENT: FRANK KING, THE PRESS; JEFF VICE, THE DESERET NEWS; LEANN MOODY, THE DAILY HERALD; JEANETTE ROBERTSON, A TEACHER FROM SPANISH FORK HIGH SCHOOL, SIX STUDENTS, AND MR. AND MRS. ED WHITE.

SIX STUDENTS FROM THE FUTURE BUSINESS LEADERS OF SPANISH FORK HIGH SCHOOL, AND THEIR TEACHER, ASKED THE COUNCIL FOR DIRECTION IN PERFORMING SOME COMMUNITY SERVICE. THE COUNCIL SUGGESTED THE FOLLOWING: 1) DELIVER RESOLUTION ON DRUGS TO MERCHANTS, SO THEY WOULD UNDERSTAND WHAT THE CITY IS DOING TO REDUCE THIS PROBLEM IN THE COMMUNITY; 2) MAKE A STUDY OF VACANT OFFICE SPACE, RETAIL SPACE, AND PROFESSIONAL OFFICE SPACE AVAILABLE IN OUR BUSINESS DISTRICT, ALONG WITH FINDING THE PRICE OF THIS SPACE; 3) HELP WITH THE CHRISTMAS PROMOTION DURING THE HOLIDAY SEASON. THE STUDENTS WILL WORK WITH THE STAFF FOR MORE INFORMATION.

MR. CLYDE SWENSON PRESENTED THE CANVAS OF VOTES FROM THE PRIMARY ELECTION HELD OCTOBER 3, 1989. COUNCILMEMBER LEIFSON MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE TALLY OF VOTES AS PRESENTED, WITH A CHANGE OF FIVE VOTES FOR BRYAN JEX, WITH A SECOND RECEIVED FROM COUNCILMEMBER CHAPPLE. THE MOTION PASSED WITH A UNANIMOUS VOTE.

MR. SWENSON ALSO ASKED THE COUNCIL HOW MUCH THE JUDGES SHOULD BE PAID FOR THE PRIMARY. THE MOTION TO PAY THE JUDGES \$50 WAS RECEIVED BY COUNCILMEMBER SHAW, WITH THE SECOND RECEIVED BY COUNCILMEMBER LEIFSON. THE MOTION PASSED WITH A UNANIMOUS VOTE. COUNCILMEMBER SHAW MENTIONED THAT THE LIBRARY RECEIVED A GRANT OF OVER \$5,000 FROM THE STATE.

COUNCILMEMBER CHAPPLE READ RESOLUTION 89-6, A RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT THE 1998 WINTER OLYMPIC BID TO HOST THE OLYMPICS WITHIN THE STATE OF UTAH. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER CHAPPLE TO ACCEPT A RESOLUTION 98-7. THE SECOND WAS RECEIVED BY COUNCILMEMBER SHAW.

THE MOTION PASSED WITH A UNANIMOUS VOTE.

RESOLUTION 89-5, A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING SUPPORT OF THE NEBO SCHOOL DISTRICT TOBACCO, ALCOHOL, AND DRUG POLICIES, RECEIVED A MOTION OF APPROVAL FROM COUNCILMEMBER HARRISON, WITH A SECOND FROM COUNCILMEMBER LEIFSON. THE MOTION PASSED WITH A UNANIMOUS VOTE.

THE PARTICIPATORY AGREEMENT FOR THE SOUTH VALLEY SOLID WASTE DISTRICT WAS INTRODUCED FOR APPROVAL. COUNCILMEMBER HARRISON MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE PARTICIPATORY AGREEMENT. THE SECOND WAS RECEIVED BY COUNCILMEMBER WOODHOUSE, AND THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

THE POSSIBILITY OF HAVING A PUBLIC RELATIONS REPRESENTATIVE WAS PROPOSED TO THE COUNCIL BY MAYOR J. MERRILL HALLAM. THE COUNCIL GAVE UNANIMOUS SUPPORT FOR THE MAYOR TO PURSUE THE AVENUE OF HAVING SOMEONE TAKE ON THIS JOB.

MR. OYLER TOLD THE COUNCIL ABOUT SOME ASPHALT COMPLETION, AND ABOUT CLEANING THE WEEDS ALONG NORTH MAIN STREET.

A LETTER FROM THE FORREST SERVICE WAS RECEIVED REGARDING ARTERIAL ROUTES. MR. OYLER PRESENTED THE MAP SHOWING THE NEW ASPHALTED PORTIONS OF THE ROAD LEADING TO STRAWBERRY RESERVOIR. COUNCILMEMBER HARRISON MADE A MOTION TO GIVE PERMISSION TO THE MAYOR TO SEND A LETTER OF SUPPORT TO THE FOREST SERVICE REGARDING ARTERIAL ROUTE "E". A SECOND WAS RECEIVED FROM COUNCILMEMBER LEIFSON, WITH THE MOTION PASSING UNANIMOUSLY.

THE MEETING ADJOURNED AT 7:55 PM, AFTER WHICH THE COUNCIL VIEWED A VIDEO REGARDING THE 1998 WINTER OLYMPIC BID.
