Minute Passage

The minutes of the May 2, 1990 meeting received a **motion** of passage from Councilmember Woodhouse. A **second** was made by Councilmember Chapple. The motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.

Springville City Royalty

The royalty of Springville City invited the council and citizens to their Art City Days celebration held June 4 - 9.

Utah Transit Authority

Ms. Joan Thompson approached the council regarding the Utah Transit Authority. Ms. Thompson has represented people from the community who wish to have UTA in the city. Steve Willingham, another proponent of UTA, approached the council regarding their opinions a

proposal for the city. The representatives would like to see the UTA option go on the ballot in November. Mr. Oyler was instructed to contact UTA this week regarding the non-unanimous support of the council.

Odyssey of the Mind - Financial Assistance Request

Ms. Rovene West, and students of the Intermediate School, approached the council regarding funding for the Odyssey of the Mind student group who will be attending an event in Aimes, Iowa. Councilmember Chapple made a **motion** to give **\$200** to the group. The **second** was made by Councilmember Gordon and the motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.

Ed Barney Day Care Center

City Engineer Richard Heap discussed a letter received by Ed Barney regarding concerning a Day Care Center. Anticipated hours of traffic congestion would be early morning and early evening. Mr. Barney will need to provide parking for 6 - 8 people at full capacity. Mr. Heap reviewed the fact that the Planning and Zoning Commission did pass the area for Day Care. Councilmember Gordon mentioned that this center would be sponsored by the state. Councilmember Gordon **motioned** to accept the Day Care proposal for Mr. Ed Barney. The **second** was made by Councilmember Woodhouse. The **passed** with a majority vote with Councilmember Harrison opposing.

Public Hearing - Canyon Road Annexation

The Public Hearing for the Canyon Road Annexation began at 7:30 with Mr. Heap giving the information. Time was turned to citizens in attendance to voice their opinions and to ask questions. Questions were asked regarding the Master Plan, city garbage, water hookup, irrigation delivery, and water pressure. Also reviewed was property under green belt taxes, frontage, fire hydrants, and the river water delivery system, curb and gutter, city service availability, connection to city sewer, animal rights. Also discussed was the fact that the people in the area proposed need help with the water system. The utility board is in the process of analyzing that situation to determine which way would be best to deal with the water situation. The surfacing of 1200 East was discussed - it will not be surfaced at the present time, but it is scheduled to be grated. The question was brought up regarding whether or not a plan exists to coordinate development which may occur. The biggest concern of residents had was the current condition of 1200 East. A vote was taken concerning opposition to the zoning. Citizen Dale Houghton opposed, and a letter of opposition was received from Leo William Jex.

Another vote was taken counting those opposed to the annexation if the condition of 1200 East remains in its current state. Those opposed were: Alan Evans, Merle Vincent, Reed Vincent, and Paul Gardner.

The council tabled a decision on the hearing until a later date.

Bids - Bank Services

The information regarding Bank Bids for a three year term were reviewed by Clyde A. Swenson. A **motion** to accept the bid was given by Harrison to accept the bid from First Security. A **second** was made by Councilmember Woodhouse and the motion **passed** with a majority vote. Councilmembers Chapple and Shaw voting in opposition.

Title 5 Revision - Alcoholic Beverages

City Attorney Junior Baker reviewed Ordinance 07-90 which is a revised section in Title 5 on Alcoholic Beverages. After some discussion, the item was tabled for a later date to allow for revisions to be made.

The meeting adjourned at 9:40 pm.
