

**ADOPTED MINUTES
SPANISH FORK CITY COUNCIL MEETING
SEPTEMBER 5, 1990**

The meeting was called to order at 7 pm by Mayor Marie W. Huff. The pledge of allegiance was led by Chief Dee Rosenbaum.

Councilmembers Present: Mayor Marie W. Huff, Jerald M. Chapple, Sheldon Gordon. Rex Woodhouse and T. Page Harrison were excused.

Staff Members Present: David A. Oyler, City Manager; Clyde A. Swenson, Finance Director/Recorder; Richard Heap, City Engineer; Dee Rosenbaum, Public Safety Director; Junior Baker, City Attorney; and Mary-Clare Maslyn, Administrative Assistant.

Citizens Present: LeAnn Moody, Daily Herald; The Press; Rick Williams, Joseph Anderson, and Lynn Sorenson of Pittsburgh Des Moines Steel; and Eric Tuten.

Minute Passage

Councilmember Shaw **motioned** to accept the minutes of the August 15, 1990 Council meeting with mentioned changes, along with warrants. This motion was **seconded** by Councilmember Gordon. The motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.

Pittsburgh Des Moines Steel Asphalt/Curb & Gutter

Mr. Anderson, of Pittsburgh-Des Moines Steel, approached the council regarding plans for expansion and addition of curb and gutter. Mr. Anderson said the company had spent a significant amount of money, and requested assistance from the city. In response, Councilmember Gordon **motioned** to change the current policy so that whenever a property owner installs curb and gutter on an existing road, the city would match the existing asphalt to the curb and gutter; included in this motion was that the city would match the current asphalt of PDM. A **second** was made by Councilmember Shaw. The motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.

Salary Schedule FY 91

The Public Hearing was held for the Salary Schedule of FY 91 as presented by Manger David A. Oyler. Councilmember Shaw **motioned** to accept the salary schedule of FY 91 as proposed. A **second** was made by Councilmember Chapple and the motion **passed** unanimously.

Police Car Bids

The police car bids were reviewed. The bid from Smith Auto Sales for the amount of **\$30,548.00**, low bid, received as **motion** to accept this amount. The **second** was made by Councilmember Gordon. Barber Brothers Auto bid was \$31,381.66. The motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.

City Engineer Update

City Engineer Richard Heap reviewed 1) the bid opening for the sprinkling system; 2) sidewalk replacement bid opening; 3) 4th North pedestrian safety project; 4) North Main Street Off-Ramp; and 5) Dagger Water Springs. Also, the question was raised regarding placing bulbs in the planters on Main Street.

Main Street Update and Letter Composition for Selling to Minors

Dee Rosenbaum, Chief of Police, reported to the council on the current status of Main Street. He spoke of enforcement measures and violations issued. The city has also been utilizing members of the Utah County Task Force to assist them. Mr. Rosenbaum stated that he will compose a letter, under the direction of Attorney Junior Baker, to store owners regarding selling alcohol to under age individuals. The letter will discuss how many times infractions of selling to a minor could occur before license revocation. The letter will also discuss other important items relating to alcohol.

Parking Cars for Sale

Chief Rosenbaum also discussed an ordinance regarding parking cars for sale in parking lots.

Shop Overhead Crane Bid

Councilmember Shaw **motioned** to table this item until further information could be received. A **second** was made by Councilmember Gordon, and the motion **passed** unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 8:20 pm.
