

Adopted Minutes
Spanish Fork City Council Meeting
March 20, 1991

The meeting was called to order at 7 pm by Mayor Marie W. Huff. The Pledge of Allegiance was lead by Boy Scout Mike Huff.

Minute Passage

Councilmember Woodhouse made a **motion** to accept the minutes of the March 6, 1991 meeting. A **second** was made by Councilmember Gordon, and the motion **passed** unanimously.

Award Presentations

Mayor Huff presented Larry Forsey with a certificate of appreciation for serving four years on the airport board.

Mayor Huff also presented a certificate to Lane Henderson and the Spanish Fork Press for their outstanding publication performance for 1990. The Press received several state awards for their newspaper publishing.

LeAnn Moody presented the Council with tickets to the children's musical.

Resolution 91-02: Resolution Bond Utah Valley Special Events Center

Councilmember Woodhouse made a **motion** to accept Resolution 91-02: A resolution of the City Council of Spanish Fork requesting the Utah County Commission to place before the people of Utah County, a special bond election in the amount of \$7,700,000.00. To help plan and construct the Utah Valley Special Events Center. Councilmember Gordon made a **second**, and the motion **passed** unanimously.

Residency Requirement Proposal

City Manager Oylar reviewed the residency policy as proposed, which will be in the personnel policy manual. Councilmember Harrison made a **motion** accepting Article 1.13.1, as proposed: A. Spanish Fork City does not maintain a residency requirement for employment, other than the following positions: city manager, city finance director/recorder, city treasurer, public works director/engineer, public safety director/chief of police, recreation director. Individuals appointed to these positions must maintain residency in city limits within six (6) months of appointment. Non-compliance with this requirement may jeopardize the employee's standing with the city. The **second** was made by Councilmember Shaw. After some discussion, the motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.

Councilmember Harrison made a **motion** to accept the Ordinances 03-91 and 04-91, as proposed, with an addition to Ordinance 04-91. The **second** was made by Councilmember Woodhouse. The motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.

Public Hearing - Merrill Annexation

Engineer Heap explained the annexation as outlined. Councilmember Gordon made a **motion** to accept the Merrill Annexation. Councilmember Shaw made the **second**, and the motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.

Public Hearing - Allred Annexation

Engineer Heap explained the annexation as outlined. After some discussion from citizens and property owners, Councilmember Gordon made a **motion** to extend the hearing for two more weeks. Councilmember Shaw made a **second**, and the motion **passed** with a majority vote of 3-2; Councilmember Shaw and Gordon, and Mayor Huff voted in favor, while Councilmembers Woodhouse and Harrison voted opposed.

Sanders Annexation Petition

A new submittal for the Sanders Annexation petition was presented to the council. Councilmember Shaw made a **motion** to send the annexation petition to the Planning and Zoning Commission. Councilmember Gordon made a **second**, and the motion **passed** unanimously.

Gun Club Information Session

City Manager presented information to property owners who currently live near the gun club. Several property owners were present for the session. Recently the city has received a grant for \$250,000 to expand the facility to include hunter education facilities, and other ranges for legal

shooting.

Mr. Leonard Ellis acted as a spokesperson to speak for the surrounding neighbors. Many of the residents expressed their concerns regarding alcohol abuse, unsafe gun handling, speeding on the roads, width of the road, campfires, and the safety of children.

The Mayor and Council thanked the citizens for their concern and for their comments. They said they will look toward improving the current conditions which exist, and will consider the input of the citizens when planning future development. The council will meet with state officials regarding the grant proposal.

The meeting adjourned at 9:45 pm.
