

Adopted Minutes
Spanish Fork City Council Meeting
December 4, 1991

Minute and Warrant Passage

Councilmember Woodhouse made a **motion** to accept the minutes of the November 20, 1991 City Council meeting, along with presented warrants. The **second** was made by Councilmember Gordon. The motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.

900 North Power Line

Mayor Huff announced that the council had made a decision to keep the proposed line on the original 900 North location.

After this announcement, many citizens replied. Citizens spoke on the situation with property value, safety, appearance, costs, location options, and underground lines. They included: Madge Johnson of 391 East 900 North; Raymond Degn of 546 East 900 North; Ed White of 289 East 900 North; Mr. and Mrs. (Hilda) Wilson; Gloria Carlson 235 East 900 North; Sheldon Maughan of 268 East 900 North; Mrs. Raymond Hall of 258 East 900 North; and Mr. Johnson of 391 East 900 North, and Dorothy Carrasco of 460 East 900 North.

Councilmember Shaw mentioned that she had done some research to find out the impact of overhead power lines. She spoke with many power company representatives.

Councilmember Gordon also expressed his opinion, including his conversations with experts on electricity.

Councilmember Harrison spoke concerning his opinion. He spoke of the changes which have taken place since the early decade of the 80's. He mentioned that the city councils and administrations have always looked toward the future for the city. The decisions that have been made have not been easy, but those decisions have been made with the people of Spanish Fork in mind.

Councilmember Woodhouse also voiced his opinion. He mentioned the history of smaller cities in decision making with power situations. He said that a series of loops will occur in the future, it will not be limited to only one loop.

Councilmember Gordon made a **motion** to adjourn the meeting. The **second** was made by Councilmember Woodhouse, and the motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.

The meeting adjourned at 8:05 pm.
