

**Adopted Minutes  
Spanish Fork City Council Meeting  
January 19, 1999**

The meeting was called to order 6:30 pm by Mayor Dale R. Barney for a preliminary review of the agenda. At 7:00 pm, the pledge of allegiance was led by Councilmember Everett Kelepolo.

Elected Officials Present: Mayor Dale R. Barney, and Councilmembers Sherman E. Huff, Everett Kelepolo, Thora L. Shaw, and Clyde A. Swenson. Councilmember Lillian J. Shepherd arrived at 7:20 pm.

**Minutes**

Councilmember Huff made a **motion** to approve the minutes of the January 12, 1999 Spanish Fork City Council meeting as presented. Councilmember Shaw **seconded**, and the motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.

**Employee of the Quarter**

Mayor Barney presented Claire B. White with the employee of the quarter for the fourth quarter of 1998. Ms. White is the City Treasurer. The Mayor and Council commended Ms. White for this honor.

**Bid - Canyon Road Secondary Irrigation**

Mr. Heap reviewed the bids for the Canyon Road secondary irrigation water line. Mr. Heap reminded the Council that this project is tied to the Ensign-Bickford water clean-up project, and therefore the bid needs to be contingent on the State's approval of the Ensign-Bickford project.

Mr. Heap recommended the bid be awarded to Vancon in the amount of \$564,304.25. He indicated the work on the water line has to be completed by April 15, 1999.

Councilmember Swenson made a **motion** to accept the bid from Vancon in the amount of \$564,304.25 for the 12" irrigation line on Canyon Road contingent upon approval of the Ensign-Bickford project by the State. Councilmember Kelepolo **seconded**, and the motion

**passed** with a unanimous vote.

### **Spanish Fork East LDS Church - Preliminary Plat**

The LDS Church is proposing to construct a facility at 2960 East 1660 South. A portion of this lot is located in Dave Olsen's development, the Oak View Subdivision. The other portion is property owned by Dale R. Barney.

Mr. Heap stated City standards require that churches and schools be located on collector roads. The road (1660 South) along the south side of the lot will be designated as a collector. 1660 South also ties to 2960 East which is designated a collector road. The Development Review Committee and Planning Commission recommended approval of the preliminary plat with conditions.

*\*\*Note: Councilmember Shepherd arrived at 7:20 pm.*

Mr. Roger Knell, architect for the LDS Church stated this building will be similar to the church recently constructed on Canyon Road. He outlined the building and noted other areas in Spanish Fork where LDS churches may be built. Mr. Knell expressed his feeling the City should look at amending the ordinance which requires churches to locate on collector roads. He stated Sundays are generally an off-peak time as far as traffic is concerned. Mr. Knell indicated some LDS churches in Provo City have BYU students traveling from all parts of the City. He feels in that situation a collector road may be necessary, but does not personally see Spanish Fork getting to the point where churches are needed on collector roads. Mr. Heap stated when cars are parked on both sides of a street that has only 30 feet of asphalt the traveling area is greatly decreased.

Councilmember Shaw made a **motion** to approve the Spanish Fork East LDS Church Preliminary Plat subject to the secondary irrigation being shown on the plat, and the fire line being looped. Councilmember Huff **seconded**, and the motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.

### **Other Business**

Mr. Oyler asked the Council their understanding of when the jersey barriers in the Hearthstone Development on 2900 East could be removed. The barriers were put in place during construction.

Consensus from the Council was once the developer was done with improvements, the road could be opened.

### **Public Safety Issues**

Chief Rosenbaum followed-up on public safety issues discussed at the Council's Midway retreat. Parking issues, jaywalking, pedestrians and crosswalks were discussed as well as enforcement issues.

The Mayor and Council stated their feeling that jaywalkers need to start being ticketed.

### **Feedback on Midway Meeting**

The Council briefly reviewed other items discussed at the Midway meeting.

### **Adjournment**

Councilmember Kelepolo made a **motion** to adjourn the meeting of the Spanish Fork City Council at 8:35 pm. Councilmember Shepherd **seconded**, and the motion **passed** with a unanimous vote.
