Budget Public Hearing

Spanish Fork City will hold a public hearing **June 5, at 6:00 pm** at the Spanish Fork City Office, 40 South Main Street, Spanish Fork, Utah. The purpose of the public hearing is to review the Fiscal Year 2008 Tentative Budget.

The budget includes transfer of funds which cannot be defined as reasonable allocation of costs between funds. These transfers include funds from the Electric Fund to the following Funds: the Golf Fund in the amount of \$341,267; the Swimming Pool Fund in the amount of \$88,701; and the General Fund in the amount of \$481,083.

A Volunteering Community—Thank you

This last month, over 800 incredible volunteers took time from their Saturday to help plant flowers in town. This army of volunteers planted over 120,000 flowers in 140 planters, amounting to over 2 acres of ground!

You may have seen this happening on Main Street, or you may have been a part of it. This program was started over 15 years ago to help beautify the downtown area. Since that time, it has grown to cover so many other areas of town, including the Sports Park, Senior Center, Fairgrounds and Cemetery.

volunteers that come, year after year. Of this group of people, Bill Bushman, Buildings and Grounds Manager for Spanish Fork City said, "We do not have the manpower to do this project, we rely completely on our volunteers, and they answer the call every year.

As City leaders contemplated this program many years ago, they believed that community involvement would, among other things, create commu-

Memorial Day Flowers at Spanish Fork Cemetery

Spanish Fork City Parks Department would like to thank all those who decorate the Cemetery with flowers for Memorial Day. It is always a beautiful sight. Because it is impossible to cut the grass with all the flowers in place, the flowers that are placed in the Cemetery to commemorate Memorial Day will be removed by the Spanish Fork City Cemetery Staff on Monday, **June 11, 2007**.

Those individuals wishing to remove the

flowers they placed must do so on or before Sunday, **June 10, 2007**. This would include all plants, cut flowers, potted flowers, artificial flowers and plants, baskets, containers, stands, and other memorabilia that were placed for Memorial Day that would obstruct the trimming and cutting of the grass. Artificial flowers in monument vases are NOT removed by the city crews because they do not obstruct grass cutting. Thank you.

Pressurized Irrigation Reminders

Please check your PI filters and make sure they are clean. A plugged or partially plugged filter will cause a reduced flow (pressure) and reduced sprinkler performance.

If you have a leak at your PI meter, (water running out of the meter box) take the lid off and reach in and turn the valve OFF (1/4 turn to the right). If the leak stops, then the leak is somewhere on your line and you are responsible to fix it. If the leak is coming out of the Meter itself, do not attempt to fix it, call the City.
