Wise Winter Weather Tips

As the winter season approaches, Spanish Fork City would like to give you a few winter tips to remember and hopefully they will spare you a little headache during these upcoming cold month:

Frozen Water Pipes

If we have another inversion similar to last year, the temperatures may stay below freezing for a couple of weeks. These cold temperatures will certainly freeze any water left in sprinkler pipes so be sure to completely drain your pipes now. These extremely cold temperatures

can also freeze some culinary water pipes deep in the ground or other pipes along poorly insulated walls. If you worry about a freezing pipe, you can leave a tap running slowly through the night. Running water will generally not freeze.

Snowplows and sidewalks

When the snow flies, City crews are dispatched almost immediately to begin plowing City streets. Plows will begin with the highest priority areas which include arterial streets, collector roads and hillside areas. State trucks will plow Main Street,

400 North, Canyon Road and Highway 6. After the priority roads are cleared, crews will then concentrate on 2nd and 3rd priority roads. Although we may not get to your street right away, know that crews are out doing the best they can. Also remember to clean off your portion of the sidewalk from snow or ice. Although this may not be required by law, it will make for safer and more walkable neighborhoods

Potholes

Potholes can form when the as-

phalt freezes and cracks. They develop quickly and without warning. With almost 30 linear miles of streets, City crews cannot know about all potholes and cannot always repair them immediately. If you see a pothole, report it to the City immediately so we can work to fix it. If your vehicle's tires are damaged by a pothole, the City will not help to repair them. Please know that potholes are a natural hazard of driving on any street. Especially during the winter months, be careful and report any potholes.

HEAT Program Now Open

Community Action Services is now accepting applications for the HEAT program, a program which assists low-income households in making utility payments through the winter season. A one-time payment per year will be submitted directly to utility companies for individuals who qualify. Disbursements are based on income. All Utah County residents interested in applying must call 373-8200 from now until the end of April for an appointment. Low-income households and those with disabilities are especially encouraged to apply. Applicants must meet income guidelines and provide all required documentation. Homebound individuals may request an Outreach worker to come to their home to assist in the application process. First-time applicants in Utah County must complete an energy education class as part of the process (energy class is waived for disabled or elderly applicants).

Please remember to vote in the General Election either by absentee or early voting or on Tuesday, November 6.


