Recycling In and Around

What is the status of recycling in Spanish Fork City? That is a question residents are asking a lot lately. Many residents may remember that the City conducted a non-scientific, internet survey a few years ago where we polled whether or not you would like to have a curbside recycling program. Many residents responded to that survey, saying they would like to see some kind of program offered.

Although a recycling program was not implemented at that time, the interest has never gone away, and in fact it has increased. Because of that, the City Council has asked staff to request pricing again from local service providers. That bid went out in February and proposals will be reviewed and presented to the City Council on Tuesday, **March 4**. Depending on delivery

costs, the City Council may decide at that time whether or not to contract for this service.

In the mean time, there are many ways residents may recycle. These methods outlined may require a little extra effort or planning, but they may be worth it.

- **Paper.** There is a bin located in the SW corner of the City Office parking lot that is for paper, newspaper and phonebooks . Also, most elementary schools and Albertson's have similar bins in their parking lots.
- **Plastic.** Albertson's and Macey's accept plastic bags. Check in store for specific details.
- **Yard Waste.** Yard waste may be taken to the compost site located



at 1800 North 1100 East, Spanish Fork.

- Plastic containers, glass or metals may require special effort traveling out of the community.

Notice to all Cable Customers: Rate Increase April 1, 2008

The City Council approved a rate increase to some of the cable packages that are offered through the Spanish Fork Community Network (SFCN). The new rates, outlined below, are required to cover the increased costs that SFCN must pay to purchase its channels. While cable channel costs increase every year, SFCN is able to absorb some of the costs and only passes on what is absolutely necessary. In fact, these increases do not completely cover all rate increases that SFCN must pay; we have continued to keep the cost low to all customers because this is YOUR network. This serves as notice to you, the customer, that the outlined rate increases will take affect **April 1, 2008**.


