ONLINE SWIMMING LESSON REGISTRATIONS

Swimming registration will begin on May 5, for residents of Spanish Fork. The online registration will begin at 12:01 am, however in order to use the online system, you must have a current liability waiver on file with a valid email address at the P&R office. If you need to update your information, call the Parks & Recreation office at 801.804.4600.

If you plan to register in person, residents may do so on May 5, beginning at 8 am, at the P&R office located at 775 N Main. Open registration, including registration for non-residents, will begin on May 6, at 12:01 am for online registration, and 8 am in the Parks & Recreation office..

The Reconline registration system is a great tool to use because it is easy to use and is immediately current. If you haven't used this tool yet, it is recommended that you go on line to the site before May 5 to



register and to familiarize yourself with the site. Taking this simple step will help alleviate frustration the day of registration. The web address is www.reconline.spanishfork.org

The budget includes transfer of funds which cannot be defined as reasonable allocation of costs between funds. These transfers include funds from the Electric Fund to the following Funds:

- Golf Course Fund..... \$150,000;
- Swimming Pool Fund \$150,000;
- Debt Service Fund \$740,000;
- General Fund \$950,000.

MAIN STREET TREE REPLACEMENT

The Honey locust trees that have beautified Spanish Fork Main Street for over 20 years have outgrown their concrete planters and must be replaced. They are damaging the utilities, irrigation and surrounding concrete. The root balls will soon be too large to extricate from their confined boxes. We must move on it now. That's the sad news.



The happy news is that we are replacing each and every old tree with a new 'Chanticleer' pear. This fruitless urban tree has been selected over the past two decades as the "urban tree of the year" by numerous arboricultural organizations. The tree shows a white flowering magnificence in the spring and its plum fall color tinged with claret makes it a popular fall plant. This Pyrus Calleyana variety has a medium growth, upright-pyramidal habit that will enhance the visibility of the businesses it adorns and still provide the tree-lined Main Street we have enjoyed.

The tree replacement project will commence this spring in the most critical areas and continue in October, 2010. The autumn, 2010, planting of the bulbs and pansies will be cancelled in September, 2010, to make way for this tree project. The remaining trees will be changed out in the Spring of 2011.



LIBRARY NEWS

PROPER DISPOSAL OF UNUSED MEDICATION

Prescription, or over the counter medications, should not be flushed down the toilet or poured down a sink. You may bring them to the Police Department, located at 789 W Center, from 8 am to 5 pm. The Spanish Fork Police Department has been designated as a safe site to dispose of medication.

Medications stored or disposed of improperly, present two major problems:

Studies have shown that pharmaceuticals and over the counter drugs are present in our nation's waterbodies and certain drugs may cause ecological harm. Outdated or unusable drugs that are disposed of by flushing or pouring down a sink, enter the environment because wastewater treatment facilities do not remove them.

In addition, storing unused or outdated prescriptions creates an opportunity for illicit use. One in five teens report intentionally misusing someone else's prescription drugs to get high. Nearly half say they get the medications from friends and relatives for free.



CABLE TV RATE INCREASE

SFCN will raise cable TV rates, effective June 1, 2010. This increase only covers additional costs charged to SFCN by many of the channels it carries. SFCN is also in a contract dispute with Showtime, so this channel will be dropped and new rates will be as follows:
