Monday, May 6: Cemetery crews will dispose of all remaining decorations

Mother's Day

Thursday, May 9: Families may begin decorating for Mother's Day

Sunday, May 19: Mother's Day decorations must be removed

Monday, May 20: Cemetery crews will dispose of all remaining decorations

Memorial Day

Thursday, May 23: Families may begin decorating for Memorial Day

Sunday, June 2: Memorial Day decorations must be removed

Monday, June 3: Cemetery crews will dispose of all remaining decorations

HAVE YOU CHECKED YOUR PI VALVE?

Get out and turn off your PI valve and your sprinkler system clock before the PI water turns on. Crews will begin soon to fill the system and an open valve will mean water will flow freely through broken pipes or sprinklers. To avoid a flooded home, check your valve and system clock immediately.
