NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Spanish Fork City is proposing to increase its property tax revenue.

-The Spanish Fork City tax on a \$174,600 residence would increase from \$115.62 to \$117.25, which is \$1.63 per year.

-The Spanish Fork City tax on a \$174,600 business would increase from \$210.22 to \$213.19 which is \$2.97 per year.

If the proposed budget is approved, Spanish Fork City would increase its property tax budgeted revenue by 0.84% above last year's property tax budgeted revenue excluding new growth.

Spanish Fork City property tax revenue from new growth and other sources will increase from \$1,482,392 to \$1,521,088.

All concerned citizens are invited to a public hearing on the tax increase.

BUILDING PERMITS FOR ACCESSORY STRUCTURES AND FENCES

Accessory Structures are buildings such as sheds, garages, and carports. Spanish Fork City is eager to make sure that fences and Accessory Structures are constructed in a manner that conforms to the City's zoning ordinance and State Regulations.

Spanish Fork City provides Building Permits, free of charge, for Accessory Structures that are less than 200 square feet and fences. Typically, these permits can be issued the same day that an application is submitted, but we suggest that residents apply a week before they plan to start construction. Applications can be made for Building Permits online at spanishfork.org by clicking on the [citizenserve](http://citizenserve.com) logo and following the provided instructions.

The City requires that Accessory Structures be at least five feet from other structures. Certain types of fences are not permitted within a specified distance from intersections and driveways. By obtaining a Building Permit before beginning construction, residents can be assured that the structures and fences they construct meet the City's requirements. CLOTHING RECYCLING

Tabitha's Way has placed a clothing recycling bin at the City Office for residents to donate unwanted and unusable clothing items. Tabitha's Way distributes or recycles these items to further its mission of providing free food and other essential supplies to local families in need. Residents can help by dropping off unwanted, torn, stained, or otherwise unusable clothing. Shoes, belts, purses, bags, linens and materials made of any fabric can also be accepted. Recycling helps reduce cost on waste removal and helps families in need in the area.

2013 General Election Voting Information

ARE YOUR REGISTERED TO VOTE?
 You can check your voter registration online at www.elections.utah.gov or by calling the Utah County elections office 801.851.8128. Individuals must register to vote no later than 30 days before any election. If you are not already a registered Utah registered voter (as of July 13), you will NOT be able to vote in this primary election.

PRIMARY ELECTION INFORMATION

The Primary Election will be conducted by Spanish Fork City. Any questions about the elections or early voting can be addressed to the City Recorder's office at 801.804.4520. 
Voter ID Required to Vote

Remember, when you vote this year, State law now requires you to bring a valid ID, such as a valid Utah Drivers License. If you do not bring valid ID, you will have to vote using a provisional ballot. Valid proof of ID must then be brought to the City Recorder within 5 days in order for your ballot to be counted.

Please remember to vote in the Primary Election either by early/absentee voting or on election day, which is Tuesday, August 13.

EARLY VOTING INFORMATION

A registered voter can vote prior to the **August 13** election date by going to the City Office. Early voting is open **July 30 to August 9, 2013** from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm.
