SAFEZONE CREATED FOR EXCHANGES

The Spanish Fork Police Department has created a safe zone to help online sellers and buyers complete their transactions.



A growing problem throughout the nation is crime resulting from online transactions. Criminals use websites like Craigslist to find victims.

When people meet to conduct a transaction from an online purchase several individuals have been robbed, assaulted or even killed.

The Spanish Fork Police Department has designated two parking stalls in the parking lot of the Justice Center for the purpose of online safe zones. The police department encourages residents who purchase items online from websites such as Craglist or KSL.com to utilize the safe zones at the Justice Center.

If you must meet with an individual to complete the transaction of an online purchase, the parking lot of the Justice Center is a safe location. If you elect to not use the designated safe zones please meet at a public location where several individuals are present. Never meet alone with an individual at a residence or a remote location.

You don't have to reside in Spanish Fork to take advantage of this program, and it is open to everyone. The safe zone parking stalls are located in the northwest section of the Justice Center parking lot and are clearly marked.

GREEN WASTE SITE CLOSING

The South Utah Valley Solid Waste District is closing the green waste site—located behind Kmart, near Wal-Mart—on December 1. After the closure, residents will be able to take their green waste for a fee to the transfer station at the north end of Main Street. The address of the transfer station is 2450 West 400 South in Springville.

The Solid Waste District released the following information regarding the closure:

"As the District Manager, I hope to clarify any misunderstandings that might be circulating about the green waste site. South Utah Valley Solid Waste District (SUVSWD) has been operating the Spanish Fork yard.

The District represents the member cities of Provo, Springville, Spanish Fork, Mapleton, Salem, Woodland Hills and Goshen. The District has maintained two green waste service sites, one in Spanish Fork and the other in Provo.

Your green waste is collected, ground and transported to the district's composting site located at the Bayview Landfill site over in Elberta. The District has set aside more than 30 acres of land to make the composting products that have been available to purchase. The cost of running this operation has grown to well over \$1Million a year and the member cities have been subsidizing the operations for several years.

The governing board of SUVSWD has been discussing options for green waste for years. The district has determined to close all operations because of how expensive they are to operate. If you have additional questions please call Terry Ficklin, the General Manager at the Transfer Station at 801.489.3027."

Spanish Fork City has been and will continue to look for viable green waste and composting options in the community. This will be very difficult because of the expensive nature of these programs. After December 1, residents can place green waste items in their black cans or take them directly to the transfer station.


FOOD FOR FINES BEGINS IN NOVEMBER

EARLY VOTING INFORMATION

A registered voter can vote prior to the **November 3** election date by going to the City Office. Early voting is open **October 20** to **October 30, 2015** from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm.

Voter ID Required to Vote

Remember, when you vote this year, State law now requires you to bring a valid ID, such as a valid Utah Drivers License. If you do not bring valid ID, you will

have to vote using a provisional ballot. Valid proof of ID must then be brought to the City Recorder within 5 days in order for your ballot to be counted.

Please remember to vote in the General Election either by early voting or on election day, which is Tuesday, November 3. Polls will be open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm.

PROPOSITION

Shall the City Council of Spanish Fork City, Utah (the "City"), be authorized to issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed Thirty-Nine Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$39,250,000) (the "Bonds") for the purpose of paying all or a portion of the costs of constructing and furnishing of a new life center, which includes a recreation/aquatics center, a senior center, and a public library and all related improvements, and for payment of expenses reasonably incurred with the construction of said facilities (the "Project") and the authorization and issuance of the Bonds; said Bonds to be due and payable in not to exceed twenty-one (21) years from the date of issuance of the Bonds?

Property Tax Cost of Bonds. If the Bonds are issued as planned, an annual property tax to pay debt service on the Bonds will be required over a period of twenty (20) years in the estimated amount of \$201.73 per year (approximately \$16.83 per month) on a \$202,000.00 (average home value in Spanish Fork) primary residence and in the estimated amount of \$366.77 per year on a business property having the same value.

The foregoing information is only an estimate (based upon current taxable values without consideration of any increase/decrease of the same over the twenty (20) year period) and is not a limit on the amount of taxes that the City may be required to levy in order to pay debt service on the Bonds. The City is obligated to levy taxes to the extent provided by law in order to pay the Bonds.

UTAH COUNTY PROPOSITION #1

AN OPINION QUESTION TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENTS SUCH AS ROADS, SIDEWALKS, TRAILS, MAINTENANCE, BUS AND RAIL SERVICE, AND SAFETY FEATURES

Shall Utah County, Utah, be authorized to impose a quarter-of-one-percent (0.25% or the equivalent of 1 cent for every \$4 spent) sales and use tax for the specific purpose of transportation improvements such as roads, trails, sidewalks, maintenance, bus and rail service, and traffic and pedestrian safety features, with the revenues divided among the county, cities and towns, and the public transit provider within the County?
