Outdoor Water Shuts Down Mid-October

Once the system is shut down, please be sure to turn off your sprinkler system. Turning your system off will prevent unintended flooding in the spring. To turn off your sprinkler system, open the green pressurized-irrigation box located near the sidewalk. Turn the valve in the box perpendicular to the pipe. Watch our how-to video at spanishfork.org/pi. Watch out for black widow spiders.

Unhook your hoses from your outside water faucets. This keeps freezing water from bursting the pipes coming from inside your home.
